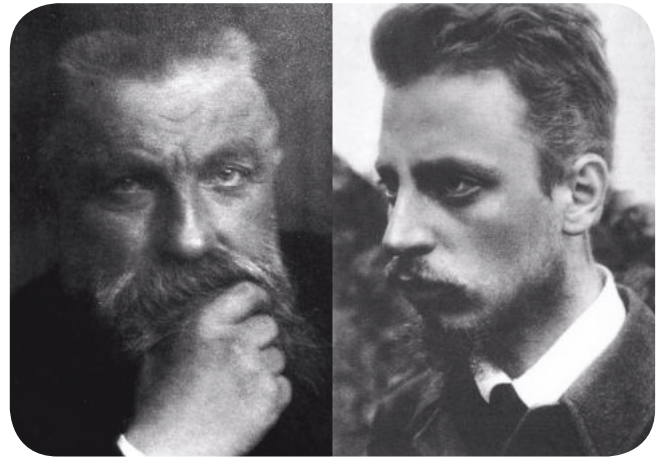


Presentation on Rainer Maria Rilke

Monday, November 15th, 2–4 p.m. on Zoom

In 1902, the poet Rainer Maria Rilke went to Paris to write about sculptor Auguste Rodin. Ten days later, Rilke wrote him a letter: “It was not only to do a study that I came to be with you—it was to ask you: How must one live?” The two men spent every day together for the next eight months. The changes this brought about in Rilke were profound.

Dr. Jon Jackson is a retired psychiatrist and depth psychotherapist, and an award-winning poet. He is a former Chair of the Numina Center for Spirituality & the Arts. He also teaches classes on “Rilke’s Letters to a Young Poet” and “A Psychological Approach to the Old Testament.”
