The peer-reviewed Journal, which has been published quarterly by the Natural Areas Association (NAA) for over 30 years, provides a forum for learning and communication among persons involved in the identification, preservation, protection and management of natural areas and natural diversity. The Journal is read by Natural Areas Association members throughout the United States and in over 30 countries, and is also available online at BioOne.org for NAA individual members and BioOne subscribers, including libraries.

This special issue of the Natural Areas Journal will deliver additional pollinator and native plant conservation tools and critical information to support the underserved areas and practitioners. It will become a unique, ongoing relevant resource summarizing plant-pollinator systems in natural areas.

This *Natural Areas Journal* special issue will include relevant works in applied conservation biology, ecological restoration, invasive and exotic species management, ecosystems, natural areas management, habitat protection, natural areas research and management, climate change and biological, bio-diversity monitoring and many others as they relate to pollinators and plants in natural areas.

The issue will be a compilation of invited and contributed papers, with at minimum 10 peer-reviewed original works, plus editorials and book reviews. A reference guide to organizations and researchers working in this important field will be developed and distributed with this issue. The publication will be available online as well as in hardcopy form.

With the scope of work and distribution of this piece it will **reach a wide audience and will become a reference guide** for land managers as well as: educators, scientists, government agencies, for-profit companies, non-profit organizations, plus others interested in this vital subject.

Why this Special Issue

Our goal is to enhance conservation, education, restoration, and research as they relate to plants and pollinators in natural landscapes. The issue will address data and knowledge gaps in the native plant and native pollinator management realm.

The role of pollinators in plant conservation has been recognized for some time. Between 75 and 85% of all flowering plants depend on pollinators for reproduction, meaning that **the conservation and management of natural floral communities depends on the conservation and management of pollinators**.

Scientists, government agencies, and conservation groups have highlighted the critical roles that pollinators play in agricultural systems, bringing concern and action in these landscapes to the mainstream. Our knowledge of pollinators in natural landscapes, where their roles are not easily monetized or linked to our daily lives, yet vital to sustaining the majority of ecological services, are still underrepresented, underfunded, and underappreciated. Specifically there is:

1) a deficit of basic information on plant-pollinator interaction in wildland and natural systems;

2) a deficit of technical guidance and peer-reviewed management practices for natural areas; and

3) a need to further educate managers, volunteers and the interested public on the roles and diversity of native pollinators in natural landscapes.

Providing public and private land managers; land trust staff and volunteers, government staff, and the general public with the tools to assess, monitor, and manage these systems **will improve the overall sustainability of natural areas and the ecosystem services they provide.**

Outcomes

This special issue of the Natural Areas Journal will deliver additional pollinator and native plant conservation tools and critical information to support the above underserved areas and practitioners. It will become a unique, ongoing relevant resource summarizing plant-pollinator systems in natural areas.

Editorial Board

Work on this special issue is already underway, under the guidance of lead Journal Editor Dr. Ron Hiebert, Northern Arizona University, and guest co-editor Dr. Vicki Wojcik, Research Program Manager at the Pollinator Partnership. Ron and Vicki have secured an in-house and guest editorial board, and four potential articles have already been submitted. The editorial committee has completed a list of solicitations for additional articles. There is a nine month timeline for the publication of this special issue. With a start in the first quarter of 2013 we anticipate a completed issue in 2013 or early 2014, dependent on scheduling and funding outcomes.

Outreach and Promotion

Outreach related to this special issue will include: the NAA and P2 websites, distribution and advertising at the 2013 and 2014 annual Natural Areas Conferences, on the NAA and P2 websites, announcements in the online and hardcopy Natural Areas Journal quarterly issues, promoting at other relevant meetings of land management organizations, and through the mailing of hardcopies to targeted stakeholder groups.

Funding Need

The cost to develop, manage, edit, produce and distribute this special issue is approximately \$35,000.
