### Speakers:

Dr. Betina Blochtein is a zoologist and a professor at the Pontifical Catholic University in Porto Alegre, South Brazil. Her area of research is bee ecology with an emphasis on stingless bees and agricultural pollination.

MSc. Rosana Halinski is a biologist and PhD student in the Zoology Program at the Pontifical Catholic University in Rio Grande do Sul, Brazil. Her area of research is insect pollination and productivity associated with modelling of distribution of stingless bees in canola fields.

Dr. Peter Kevan is the Scientific Director of the Canadian Pollination Initiative Strategic Network (NSERC-CANPOLIN) and a Professor Emeritus at the University of Guelph, Ontario, Canada. He has published in almost every aspect of pollination biology from autecological studies through biodiversity surveys to economic assessments of the importance of pollinators.

12:30pm (UTC-6) Mountain Daylight Time and Central Standard Time\* (e.g. Edmonton, Denver, Ciudad Juárez, Mexico City, Regina)

1:30pm (UTC-5) Central Daylight Time, Colombia Time, and Peru Time (e.g. Winnipeg, Chicago, Bogota, Lima)

2:30pm (UTC-4) Eastern Daylight Time and Bolivia Time (e.g. Toronto, New York, La Paz)

3:30pm (UTC-3) Atlantic Daylight Time, Brasília Time, Argentina Time, Chile Summer Time\*\* (e.g. Halifax, Salvador, Buenos Aires, Santiago)

*\*Central Standard Time is only for those that do not observe Central Daylight Time (e.g. Regina) or do not switch until a later date (e.g. Mexico City, which changes on April 6). \*\*Chile does not change to Standard Time until April 26.*
