

Integrated Monarch Monitoring Program



The Integrated Monarch Monitoring Program (IMMP) is designed to collect a variety of information about monarchs and their habitats. Data collected will inform monarch population and habitat targets, help scientists understand the threats monarchs face, and inform habitat enhancement strategies.

The IMMP is divided into several activities; participants can choose which one(s) to do at a monitoring site. Monitoring sites may either be a priority-ranked site selected by the IMMP or a site of your choosing.
