Creating habitat on managed lands is a key part of supporting pollinator populations, and electric power projects throughout north America add up to a huge amount of potential habitat. Managing these areas with pollinators in mind can have significant benefits for bees, butterflies, and other wildlife, as well as those managing and using the rights-of-way.

Join the North American Pollinator Protection Campaign (NAPPC) and the Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI) for this **free** upcoming webinar to learn about these pollinator-supporting projects and the Pollinator Electric Power Award, which highlights exemplary conservation efforts. Suzanne Fisher from the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) and Hanna Franklin and Kathleen Ave from the Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) will provide an overview of the work they have done that won them this award in 2024 and 2025, respectively.
